Did you know?



If you pick up a can of paint and saw this symbol, would you know what it represents?

This symbol is one of nine on the Hazard Communication Standard Pictogram. The Hazard Communication Standard (HCS) requires pictograms on labels to alert users of the chemical hazards to which they may be exposed. Each pictogram consists of a symbol on a white background framed within a red border and represents a distinct hazard(s). The pictogram on the label is determined by the chemical hazard classification.
