NAWIC Founders' Scholarship Foundation deadlines approaching



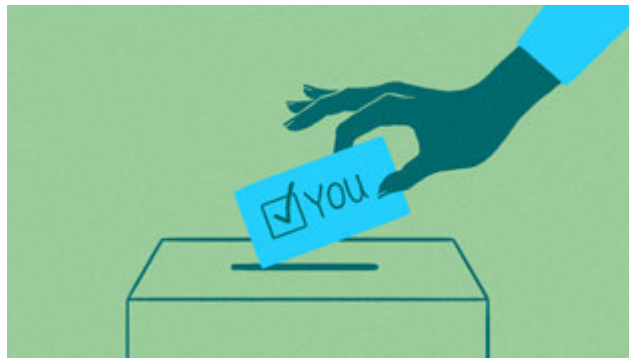
